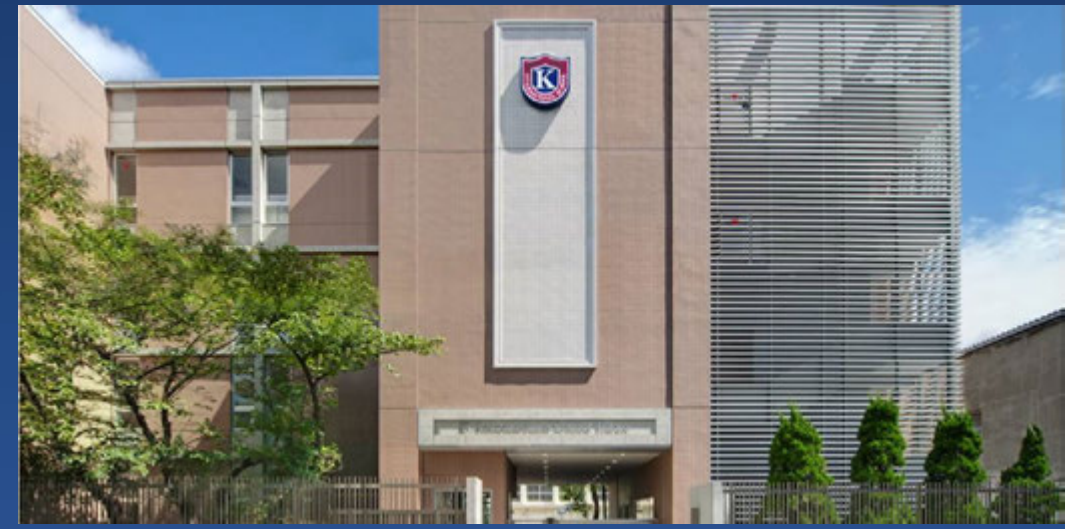

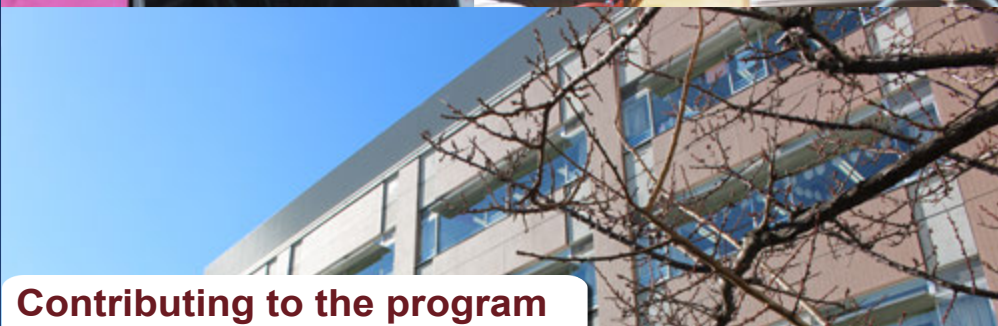

Program overview

KIST's **Future Horizons Scholarship Program** supports children who have demonstrated excellence in academics, exceptional moral character and the potential to make extraordinary contributions to our global society in the future as the next generation of leaders, but who would not normally have the opportunity to receive a quality international education due to financial need. Future Horizons scholarships are awarded based on criteria, including demonstrated financial need, and support awardees with up to 100% tuition coverage as well as items necessary for learning (e.g. textbooks, laptop computer) and boarding arrangements depending on financial need and living situation. Students living either in Japan or abroad who are eligible to enter Grades 10 or 11 may apply.



Contributing to the program

At KIST, in line with our guiding beliefs, we make every effort to keep tuition fees as affordable as possible. For new enrollments, however, the total funds required until graduation—including expenses for textbooks, learning materials and external examinations as well as enrollment and capital fees and the purchase of a laptop computer—are quite considerable as shown in the table below.

Period of scholarship	Required funds
Grade 10 - 12 Non-boarding	Approx. ¥7 million
Grade 11 - 12 Non-boarding	Over ¥5 million
Grade 10 - 12 Boarding	Approx. ¥11 million
Grade 11 - 12 Boarding	Approx. ¥8 million

Based on the required funds above, we are seeking to cover ¥5 million per student through donations from contributors. In cooperation with contributors, the school will also make a contribution through the provision of a discount on school tuition fees for scholarship recipients.

We are seeking contributions from companies, organizations and individuals in units of ¥1 million. When total contributions reach ¥5 million, one student who has passed our rigorous selection process will be eligible to receive a scholarship. Depending on the amount of contributions received, scholarships for up to four students are available annually. To reach this goal, contributions of ¥20 million per year are required.

Your contributions will help nurture exceptional students who may not be able to continue their studies due to financial difficulties. Message from the Founder

In the past, international schools in Japan catered mainly to non-Japanese children and returnees, and charged high tuition fees since many were ineligible to secure government funding to operate. Only children from financially privileged families with a high social status were able to receive an international education. With the aim of improving this situation in order to provide children with an opportunity to receive a high quality international education and to nurture competent individuals able to contribute to our future global society, I founded K. International School Tokyo (KIST) with my wife in 1997.

At all grade levels from pre-kindergarten through high school, KIST offers an inquiry-based curriculum based on programs developed by the International Baccalaureate (IB). These programs are widely recognized as providing skills and knowledge essential for children to succeed in our future global society. KIST is the only school in Tokyo fully authorized to offer all three IB programs (as of 2016). Upon completion of the IB Diploma, studied during the final two years of high school, students take final examinations which are considered as an entrance requirement by universities around the world. In May 2015, 141,828 students from 2,437 schools in 138 countries sat for these examinations. KIST students achieved exceptionally high scores, and as a result, KIST is currently the highest ranking school offering the IB Diploma in Japan.

One of the features of our school is that we have a large number of exceptional students who go on to receive acceptances with full or partial scholarships from leading universities such as Princeton University and Stanford University in the USA, the University of Tokyo and Waseda University in Japan, and Seoul National University in South Korea.

At KIST, we offer a number of internal scholarships to support current students who have demonstrated excellence. On this occasion, however, as part of our continuing contribution to our global society, we have established a new scholarship program for external students who wish to join us in order to continue their studies. There are, however, financial limitations for the school in implementing a program of this scope, and therefore, we would like to ask for your cooperation and support in this initiative.

It is my sincere wish that through this scholarship program, we can provide opportunities to as many students as possible so that they can contribute to our global society in the future and help create a better world.

Global service initiatives

KIST actively contributes to our global society in many ways. Examples of our service initiatives include:

- **Habitat for Humanity**
Grade 11 students are involved in building houses for families in underprivileged areas of Thailand, Cambodia and Indonesia in conjunction with external organizations.
- **Tassel**
Providing English language instruction via videoconferencing for children in Cambodia unable to receive normal education.
- **Activities to support and commemorate the March 2011 Great East Japan Earthquake.**
Free dress days for students to wear red and white clothes to school (the colors of the Japanese flag) and donate a participation fee to orphans in Miyagi prefecture.
- **Visits by staff, students and parents to disaster stricken areas to provide necessary items and meals to survivors, and volunteer trips to affected areas and evacuation centers to help clean up and remove waste (Higashi Matsuyama city in Miyagi and Joso city in Ibaraki)**
- **Student-led activities such as providing meals for families in need and sending stationery to Africa in conjunction with external organizations.**
- **Volunteer activities at hospitals.**
- **Providing opportunities for overseas teaching interns to experience work and life in Japan.**
