Before School English Support Program (K3 – G5)

Students with insufficient language skills for learning often encounter difficulties understanding what their teachers and friends are saying, as well as expressing their ideas and feelings. This is a very stressful situation for a student to be in. This program is designed to support such students by focusing on basic language skills and understanding. Through this approach, we aim to help create an enjoyable and interesting learning environment that will allow students to actively learn at school.

This program is geared toward students that are struggling with English. We recommend that you take advantage of this program to build a strong foundation for your child's language ability.



Application Process

Applications can be made on the LEAP website. Applications must be made separately each semester.

Please note that applying for a LEAP class does not automatically secure a place in the class. All applications are subject to a compulsory screening for eligibility. Depending on the language abilities of applicants it is possible some applications will not pass the initial screening stage. All applicants will be notified by email about the status of the LEAP application within 3 working days of applying. Seats are limited, and priority will be given to those who have a strong need for English support and have received a recommendation letter.

G1 – G5 Class Structure

Classes will be focused on small group guiding reading, and writing, as well as increasing English vocabulary through activities derived from the British Key Stage 1 curriculum.

For G1-5, students will review writing conventions such as spelling, punctuation, and grammar, and they will also be taught how to extend their writing, how to structure their writing, and how to use more varied vocabulary.

Homework will be given twice a week (once for G1). Any work not completed in class will also be given as homework.

2-day-a-week Small-Group Guided Reading Course

This course is designed for students who have trouble with reading and, sometimes, spoken English.

Each lesson will be based around a text where the LEAP instructor will guide a small group of students in various activities designed to improve the reading strategies that they are working on in class.

For G1, there are a total of 9 strategies, including discussing the main idea and important details, literal comprehension, sequencing, and predicting. By G5, the number of strategies increases to 15, including cause and effect, fact and opinion, and non-fiction text features.

Guided reading sessions will also include activities where students can engage in open discussion to support those who need help with their spoken English.

3-day-a-week Conventions Review and Writing Course

This course is designed for students with significant gaps in their understanding of writing conventions. Instructors will use their own materials as a basis for review, choosing a weekly 6 Plus 1 trait lesson as a mini lesson and then applying it to some writing which can then be shared or performed then peer-assessed to the 6 Plus 1 Traits rubric.
