

# LEAP Program (K3 – G5)



## K3 Jolly Phonics Review Program

Students with an insufficient grounding in phonics have difficulty accessing age-appropriate reading material, which consequently affects their academic performance across the curriculum. This program is designed to support such students by reviewing the Jolly Phonics course taught in the K2 homerooms, and includes phonics review, letter formation, and vocabulary building.

This program is geared towards students who are either struggling with the content from K2 or who are new to KIST and may have gaps in their learning through studying a different program at their previous school. We also offer the 5-day course to Grade 1 students who join the school with little to no understanding of synthetic phonics.

## G1-G5 English Support Program

Students with insufficient English skills often encounter difficulties reading age-appropriate texts, understanding what their teachers and friends are saying, as well as expressing their ideas and feelings, either verbally or through their writing. This program is designed to support such students by focusing on writing traits, reading strategies, and open discussion.

This program is geared toward students that are struggling with English. We recommend that you take advantage of this program to build a strong foundation for your child's language ability.

## K3 Class Structure

Classes will be focused on verbal communication and phonics, as well as increasing English vocabulary through activities derived from the British Key Stage 1 curriculum.

Homework will not be given; however, any work not completed in class due to behaviour issues may be given as homework.

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## **G1 – G5 Class Structure**

### **3-day-a-week English Support course**

English Support LEAP is a three-day-a-week course, and students must attend all three sessions. This course is designed for students with significant gaps in their understanding of writing conventions, and who may have difficulty reading age-appropriate texts.

Classes will be focused on writing conventions and small group guided reading, as well as increasing English vocabulary. For two sessions per week, students will review writing conventions such as spelling, punctuation, and grammar, and they will also be taught how to extend their writing, how to structure their writing, and how to use more varied vocabulary. Instructors will use their own materials as a basis for review, choosing a weekly 6 Plus 1 trait lesson as a mini lesson and then applying it to some writing which can then be shared or performed then peer-assessed to the class-generated 6 Plus 1 Traits rubric.

This course is also designed for students who have trouble with reading and, sometimes, spoken English. One session per week will be based around a text where the LEAP instructor will guide a small group of students in various activities designed to improve the reading strategies that they are working on in class.

For Grade 1, there are a total of 9 strategies, including discussing the main idea and important details, literal comprehension, sequencing, and predicting. By Grade 5, the number of strategies increases to 15, including cause and effect, fact and opinion, and non-fiction text features.

Guided reading sessions will also include activities where students can engage in open discussion to support those who need help with their spoken English.

Homework will not be given; however, any work not completed in class due to behaviour issues may be given as homework.
